Summary of my Activities and Future Plans

My name is Amit, and I am currently a lecturer at the Department of Social Work in Ruppin Academic Center. I am also a teaching associate fellow at the School of Social Work in Bar-Ilan University. My main academic specialty and interest is in the fields of community social work, macro practices in social work, social welfare, work attitudes of social workers, and interrelationships between social workers and diverse communities. In recent years, I conducted several studies in minority communities, especially in the ultra-Orthodox Jewish community in Israel.

Initially, on 2006 - I started my Bachelor's degree at the School of Social Work in the University of Haifa. During my B.A. degree, I focused on macro-practice (Community Practice; Management; Administration; Organizational Practice). I completed my Bachelor's degree on 2009, with honors (GPA: 94). Throughout my academic studies, I maintained deeply devoted to social involvement. As such, I served my fellow students as the chair of the Students' Union at the School of Social Work.

After the completion of my bachelor's degree, I decided to proceed to a Masters' degree at the School of Social Work at the University of Haifa. As a natural path to my Bachelor's degree, I decided to focus on macro-practice orientation. My studies at the M.A. program were held between the years 2009-2012. I completed my M.A. degree with honors as well (GPA: 96). On December 2012, I submitted my thesis on the topic of novice social workers' professional commitment. The thesis was awarded as exceptional thesis by the board of the school of social work.

During my M.A. degree studies, I worked as a social worker, both in the public sector (The Department of Social Services in Yoqneam, and after that – in Haifa), and in the third sector. In the public sector, I worked as a community social worker, and initiated diverse community interventions for the local communities whom I worked with. In the third sector, I worked in several organizations and positions, for example as manager of a community center in Ein Hayam (Wadi El-Jamal) neighborhood in Haifa; as a coordinator of a youth volunteering movement in Carmiel; and as a branch manager in a NGO, which aimed to aid the elderly living in Haifa and its surroundings. In recent years, I also serve as a reserve officer in the IDF, in the position of Mental Health Officer (Kaban), and offer individual, group and community therapy for soldiers and officers.

On 2015, I started my Ph.D. studies in Bar-Ilan University (School of Social Work) under the supervision of Prof. Haya Itzhaky. The dissertation focused on the phenomenon of youth volunteers in a therapeutic center. I focused on their subjective wellbeing, future orientation and leadership ability. The dissertation was approved by the Ph.D. board of the University on May 2021, and I was awarded the Ph.D. degree.

Since 2013 to date, I'm teaching several courses in the fields of social work, and mainly community social work and macro-practice in social work. Since then and during my academic and professional career, I became aware of the interweaving and reciprocal relationship between three main foci in social work: teaching, researching and implementing in the field. Therefore, I strive to develop a model that combines social work education, research in social work (both quantitative and qualitative) and implementation to practice. Since joining the academy, I have integrated both my professional and scholarly insights into the courses I teach in the field of social work.

Additionally, I have broadened the focus of my research and teaching to include issues related to contemporary issues in macro-practice, social welfare organizations, work attitudes and community practice with minority groups, as well as various aspects of the relationships between social workers and service-users. Another context, common to both my research and teaching philosophy, is the belief in people's potential ability to cope and draw strength from life situations, thus discovering new meanings in their lives. This view is reflected in my diverse studies and courses.

Looking ahead toward the future, I see myself as a part of the academic world, as a scholar and as a lecturer. The path, in which I have been walking in recent years, has taught me that I should integrate the three main domains in social work: social work education, research in social work, and implementing both into the field. On March 2021, I was promoted to the status of lecturer at the Department of Social Work in Ruppin Academic Center. I feel obligated to my role at the faculty and department, and strive to be a part of an innovative and passionate staff of social work scholars, in order to further develop the social work profession, its theories and literature. I also wish to educate social work students to help them become well-suited professionals, for the sake of their clients and for the society at large. More specifically, I would like to focus on macro-level practice, and mainly in the field of community social work and policy practice. As much as I believe in generic social work, I think I can contribute to the curriculum in this field in particular.

On October 2021, I was elected as the head of the field education unit at the Department of Social Work in Ruppin Academic Center. I find this role as especially important, as it strengthening the link between academic and fieldwork. My future plans in this role is to develop high quality studies in the various fields of social work supervision and practice.
