**K. Summary of my Activities and Future Plans**

My journey as a clinician-researcher began during my undergraduate studies at Ruppin Academic Center when I worked as a research assistant in Prof. Eyal Gamliel's lab and later as the lab manager for Prof. Ada Zohar.
